Behavioral Health Urgent Care (BHUC)

- Alternative site for person age 4 and up experiencing a crisis for behavioral health, substance use or IDD
 - Triage
 - > Assessment (psychosocial, nursing, substance use etc.)
 - Intervention
 - Referrals as needed to FBC, out patient, ect
 - IVC first evaluations as needed
 - > Can stay up to 23 hours for stabilization

BHUC

- Six 24 hours Behavioral Health Urgent Cares
- 19 Tier III Behavioral Health Urgent Cares

 11,726 – visits to Tier IV BHUC's servicing patients either emergent or urgent during SFY17

 Of the 6 sites that operate 24 hours they offer 38 observation chairs

C3 356

- Vaya RHA
 - C3356 has been opened 24 hours since July 2016
 - an average of over 200+ walk-ins per month
 - 2,979 episodes of care stabilization (through July 2017)
 - Peer Living Room 8, 019 visits since March 2016
 July 2017; and an avg. of 66 NEW individuals utilizing the service each month as of Feb. 2017
 - Neil Dobbins FBC is co-located with the BHUC

Facility Based Crisis (FBC)

"This service provides an alternative to hospitalization for adults who have a mental illness or substance use disorder. This is a 24-hour residential facility with 16 beds or less that provides support and crisis services in a community setting. This can be provided in a nonhospital setting for beneficiaries in crisis who need short-term intensive evaluation, treatment intervention or behavioral management to stabilize acute or crisis situations."

Child Facility Based Crisis Centers


- Two new sites recently selected through RFA process and funded through Dix Trust Funds
- Alliance and Vaya were the two awardees. Alliance plans to up fit an existing building in southeast Wake county. Vaya is renovating a building near Mission Hospital in Asheville
- \$1,000,000 each to cover start-up costs.
- Third site in Mecklenburg in final stages of construction with anticipated opening by end of 2017.
