


Purpose: A Quick Snapshot

- 41 of 69 System of Care ratings returned
- 59% response rate
- More than half the have >50% implementation of the SOC


Substantial Implementation

According to the ratings,

 - SOC Infrastructure
 - Commitment to the SOC Approach

Possible Next Steps


 Provide ongoing training, technical assistance, coaching, and workforce development on the SOC philosophy and approach to support expansion of the SOC approach.
